The Society was founded in 1974.

The aims of The Nayland with Wissington Conservation are to stimulate public interest in the Parish of Nayland with Wissington and the immediate surroundings, to promote high standards of planning and architecture and to secure the preservation and improvement of features of historic or public interest - including conservation of wildlife. The Society encourages and supports local business and services.

The Society is a member of the Suffolk Preservation Society (CPRE Suffolk), The Dedham Vale Society and the Suffolk Local History Council.

We have three open meetings, with specialist speakers, each year. We organise footpath walks and the long-established "Open Gardens" on the second Sunday in June. The proceeds go to support village projects and local conservation appeals.

The Nayland Meadow Project

In early 2004 the Society, through generous contributions from members and friends, purchased a 17 acre field, bordered by the River Stour to the north and close to Horkesley Road to the south. This is being managed as a meadow with sheep grazing under a Defra ESA Arable Reversion Scheme. A pond and reedbed were created by the Environmental Agency, assisted by the Dedham Vale and Stour Valley Project, and is already attracting wetland species of birds and insects. Parish residents are welcome to fish this section of the River Stour – but not the pond.
